President's Ponderings

I am thankful for the opportunities that we had in 2010. In this newsletter, you will see a handful of those opportunities mentioned. There are articles and comments from numerous guests, Pastor Walker, and ACCF men's leader Joe Lee. We could have easily doubled or tripled the articles and comments but I hope that the ones included give you a good representation of the blessings of 2010.

As the notes on the cover page show, OCM continues to increase its outings and guest numbers each year. 2011 looks to be another year of growth with the addition of higher-end housing, more fishing opportunities, and an improved website page.



OCM friend and advisor Pastor David Walker has reached an agreement with land owner Chip Briscoe to utilize the Espajo segment of the Briscoe-Gates Ranch. Pastor Walker is working out a lot of details with this but it is safe to say that OCM will be allowed to utilize the Espajo facilities from time to time. The Espajo headquarters includes a higher level of housing than the Tierretas segment. It also offers a larger cooking area, larger dining area, more yard grass cover, more trees, and a swimming pool. It is only 6 miles from paved road as opposed to 16 miles at the Tierretas. Pastor Walker said OCM might get to use some of the fishing

ponds as well (but we might have to wear a blind fold going in and out). OCM will continue to use the Tierretas but looks forward to using the Espajo from time to time as well.

OCM friends Gordon Merrill and Andy Burnett have worked to improve the OCM website. The website now features our past news articles and more information about the OCM operations. Donations can now be made electronically through the web site with use of PayPal.

After two years of serving as Vice President, Steve Money has asked OCM to fill his role. Distance is the primary consideration for Steve since he lives in north Texas. Floss Morrison, mother of OCM founder Lee Morrison, has agreed to serve in the Vice President role in 2011. After three years in the role as OCM secretary/treasurer Pastor Jerry Smith has asked OCM to look for another officer for this role. Jay Gunn, a frequent time and resource contributor to OCM, will serve as secretary/treasurer. Pastor Jerry will continue as an OCM volunteer in other ways. Background notes for Floss Morrison and Jay Gunn are listed in this newsletter.

We begin our fourth year of operation and we trust that the Lord will continue to give us direction and provision.

Odds and Ends

OCM OPERATIONS

We are often asked what kind of supplies or donations are needed at the ranch. We really appreciate the question and the donations that have been given. The list of items and their priority seems to change almost weekly as it might around your own house. For example, a leaky outside water faucet might be high on your home's list until the air conditioner unexpectedly goes out. Or changing the oil in your lawn mower is needed until the mower's shaft gets bent. So we often pause before we answer that question because the priority can change quickly.

As we plan trips to Outdoor Christian Ministries (OCM), the planning starts as we pack to come home from the last trip. We take written notes on maintenance and supply needs on any of the 22 blinds, 30 feeders, 2 old ranch vehicles, ATV, 2 lawnmowers, weed eater, cameras, and the 6 houses with all their air conditioners, windows, roofs, plumbing, refrigerators, bedding materials, coffee pots, etc. We also take notes on the basic supplies of paper towels, paper plates, dish soap, clothes detergent, garbage bags, batteries, ranch vehicle fuel, cleaners, and all the other things that keep households functional. There are numerous OCM teaching handouts that we track and print to maintain supplies for guests.

The first week back home after an OCM trip usually includes a day of mowing and weed eating our own lawn and catching up on mail/email. Shortly after that volunteers communicate about the next retreat needs including guest list, transportation list, retreat agenda, helper list.

Store trips to Home Depot, Academy, Wal-Mart, Office Depot, and HEB begin about a week before we go back. Inevitably one of the volunteers will think of something we had not previously noted and we'll make another store visit. Most of the time volunteers are purchasing supplies without any reimbursement from OCM as nearly all monetary donations are used for land lease costs. (Without funding for the land lease, we won't need any supplies.)

A work trip in late July 2010 of four volunteers had one truck with the following items in the back: portable welder, air compressor, metal chop saw, chain saw, pipe tubing, door hinges, roll of electrical wiring, 2-5 gallon gas cans, cameras, 2 tool boxes, 10 bags of corn, shelving, bedding, clothes, household supplies, and food for 3 days.

This is a glimpse of the OCM operations. The volunteers are great and they are sincerely thankful to get a chance to serve others in an outdoor Christian setting.
